

Staging to get Suyers to fall in love with your home

Most buyers will see your house for the first time on the internet, so it pays to have the best photos to show your house at its best. Great photos begin with great staging. Your investment into staging will pay off in a quicker sale and for more money.

Buyers typically look at five or more homes before making a choice. And the majority will decide within the first five seconds of seeing a house. The following are suggestions to make YOUR house the best possible choice.



But you don't have to take my word for it. A recent survey from the NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF REALTORS® revealed that: 77% of buyers' agents said staging makes it easier for their buyer to visualize the property as their future home. It's like helping the buyer dream it so they can achieve it — and so you and your agent can make the sale.

39% of sellers' agents said staging a home greatly decreases the amount of time a house is on the market. For you, time saved could mean moving into your new house even sooner.

21% of sellers' agents said staging a home increases its dollar value between 6% and 10%. Simply put, that may lead to more money in your pocket.



Depersonalize your home. Remove personal pictures, etc. You want the buyers to picture their family in the home, not yours.



# Focus on the Rooms that count the most

You don't have to stage your whole house to make buyers swoon.

Staging the rooms where people tend to spend the most time usually makes the biggest impression on buyers. Start with the living room, followed by the master bedroom and the kitchen.

Keep in mind that you're not going for an HGTV-worthy overhaul: Even small touches, like putting fluffy towels in the bathroom or replacing shabby throw pillows in the family room, can make your home that much more attractive.

()h, and by the way: tage your yard, too!

Your house must look its best — inside and outside. After all, buyers form their first impression when they pull up in front of your home. It's no surprise, then, that curb appeal — how your home looks from the exterior — can increase your home's sales value up to 17%, a Texas Tech University study found.

If you've never had your yard professionally landscaped, now may be the time to do it. Landscaped homes have a sales price advantage ranging from 5.5% to 12.7%, according to research by Alex Niemiera, a horticulturist at Virginia Tech. That would mean an extra \$16,500 to \$38,100 in value on a \$300,000 home.

Professional landscaping, however, can cost a lot. You're aiming for polish, not a new garden of Versailles. If budget is a concern, start with some DIY improvements.

# Getting Started

#### **#1** Take Inventory

Take note of the preexisting features in your home you can highlight for house decorating ideas. Architectural details such as crown molding, wooden beams, hardwood floors, built-in bookshelves, and mosaic-tile backsplashes are all worth focusing on. These details don't just look expensive; they are expensive. Make them as prominent as possible—keep them clean, clutter-free, and the focal point of the room. For example, don't splurge on an expensive painting just to have it compete with a show-stopping fireplace.

### #2 Three's Company

Mixing the right accessories can make a room more inviting. When it comes to eye-pleasing accessorizing, odd numbers are preferable, especially three. Rather than lining up a trio of accessories in a row, imagine a triangle and place one object at each point. Scale is important, too, so in your group of three be sure to vary height and width, with the largest item at the back and the smallest in front. For maximum effect, group accessories by color, shape, texture, or some other unifying element, stagers suggest.

#### #3 Make it Bigger

To make a room appear to be bigger than it is, paint it the same color as the adjacent room. If you have a small kitchen and dining room, a seamless look will make both rooms feel like one big space.








The most impactful way to create an intentionally designed look is to create a decorating colour palette and stick with it.

Choose a fabulous piece of artwork, area rug or a fabric with multiple colours to

establish the perfect colour palette. Simply pick up two or three colours from

the pattern and repeat. Then repeat them again in adjacent rooms for flow.






It's next to impossible to create an intentional look if you are holding on to too much filler and things that don't work. Everything in the room should have a place and a role. And ideally, they should work with the color palette. I know you've heard it before, but it really is important to get rid of clutter and dust-collecting knick-knacks that aren't serving you or the look and feel of the room.

Rather than trying to work everything around the dumpy chair, you don't like, see if you can just let it go. Maybe you can find an inexpensive but fresher one, or even a thrifted one in a better shape and color. It can be tricky to get objective about your stuff. A great way to see a room with fresh eyes is to remove EVERYTHING that is non-essential and only bring it back and add in things that serve the look and feel and color palette you want to create. You are likely to find that your room feels more comfortable and refreshed with A LOT LESS in it.

### Tip#3

# Add a little bling



One special high-end piece can elevate any room. Often, it's a light fixture or a striking piece of art.

This simple white dining room below comes to life with a glamorous and current brass chandelier. Or it could be the perfect antique mirror for over the mantel or that stylish Saarinen dining table you've been coveting.

In each room, choose one key element that brings in some bling to create an elevated look.

# Tip #4 Create Atmosphere with Lighting

I can't emphasize this enough. Rarely without a designer's intervention do people have enough mood lighting in their rooms. If you don't have the budget for anything else, get lamps.

In order to add more lamps to a room, consider where you might add

a table or surface to put them on. Maybe you need a slim sofa table, a credenza on a blank wall, or larger end tables to accommodate more lamps. Wall sconces and floor lamps are good too. Just don't expect your room to have a cozy high end feel if you are relying on pot lights.

# What about bulbs

As it turns out, many of our homes are improperly lighted. To remedy the problem, increase the wattage in your lamps and fixtures. Aim for a total of 100 watts for each 50 square feet. Don't depend on just one or two fixtures per room, either. Make sure you have three types of lighting: ambient (general or overhead), task (pendant, undercabinet or reading) and accent (table and wall).



Lainting

Painting a living room a fresh neutral color helps tone down any dated finishes in the space. Even if you were weaned on off-white walls, take a chance and test a quart of paint in a warm, neutral hue. These days, the definition of neutral extends way beyond beige, from warm tans and honeys to soft blue-greens. As for bold wall colors, they have a way of reducing offers, so go with neutrals in large spaces.

A big part of the reason people agonize so much about paint colors is that paint has impact. Just the right paint color can definitely pull together a room. It can create a fresher look or it can create drama.

A new paint color will certainly create a refreshing change, but remember it can't do all the heavy lifting.



### Tip #6

Every room needs a little sparkle. Reflective surfaces add and amplify light, they bring a sense of glamour, and most often, they are less visually heavy than more solid materials.

A glass coffee table is always a good idea.

You can place a mirror anywhere, try a large one leaning against a wall to reflect some light and expand the view. Mirrors and lighting go hand-in-hand, as a few strategically placed mirrors, paired with the perfect lighting, can create the illusion that your space is far larger than it actually is. Simply hang your mirror across a lighting source, like a window or lamp light, to create this illusion.





Tip #7

Hops of Art Work



Every room needs a focal point. A large scale piece of art or a well-designed gallery wall will instantly inject personality into any room.

Art can also set the palette. This is what gives a room identity. Mousy little drab pictures won't accomplish this. It's best to go bold with it. Look for scale and dynamic colors and textures.

### Tip #8

# Apgrading and steaming your window coverings

Drapes and window coverings can be expensive. But you can make simple off the shelf drapes look more expensive by simply hanging them correctly and adding extra panels to make them look fuller and more luxurious.

Single curtain panels will ALWAYS look cheap and chintzy. ESPECIALLY if the curtain rod is not wide enough and hung too low.

Place your curtain rod high, close to the ceiling to maximize height, and wide enough that the drapes can be gathered mostly to the outside of the window frame. This will make the window look larger. Get at least 2 or 3 panels for each side of a large window so they look nice and full. Curtain rings and a pretty rod are details that will make even big box store curtains look luxurious.



Aligh-End tip

Make sure your window coverings look clean and crisp. You can machine wash most curtains and lightly dry them, if they have wrinkles, make sure you either iorn or steam them!

# Pethink Jour Hurniture Groupings

There's a common belief that rooms will feel larger and be easier to use if all the furniture is pushed against the walls, but that isn't the case. Instead, furnish your space by floating furniture away from walls. Reposition sofas and chairs into cozy conversational groups, and place pieces so that the traffic flow in a room is obvious. Not only will this make the space more user-friendly, but it will open up the room and make it seem larger.





You will enjoy the changes you accomplish from any of the tips above, but don't stop there! A room will never feel finished without some styling. No matter how well decorated your house is, it needs styling. In a well staged home every surface is styled and the room is full of personality. This is what styling does. It adds interest and personality.

However, you don't have to completely clean out your space in order to achieve an expensive aesthetic in your home. By incorporating a few key pieces in a room, you can add to the overall comfort and flow of your home's design.

From the prospective homebuyer's view, clutter translates into an undesirable home. Cluttered homes often appear smaller. They look darker and tend to smell from the excess dust. The excess stimuli can be an immediate turn-off because the combined effect suggests that all the home's other features will be rundown, decayed and in need of much repair. The converse is also true: homes devoid of clutter and kept clean give the impression of being well maintained and not requiring much work on all the lights in each room and open all blinds and drapes.

It is important to understand that when prospective buyers view a home, they do so through various lenses. Some will look at a property in terms of its resale value, others will view it as a starter home, and others will view it as their potential home for life.

## Clutter can take away value

For those looking at property in terms of resale value, clutter is a good thing. Clutter means that the property doesn't show well and as such the potential buyer stands a good chance of acquiring it below value. For those looking at a property as a starter home, the clutter only serves to widen the gap between the desired home and the home they must settle for. People looking at a property as their potential permanent home will imagine themselves occupying it. Clutter compromises the ideal image and prospective buyers view the home in terms of cleaning and maintenance.

Properties with clutter translate into increased time on the market and lower values, not only because the clutter decreases the perception of size, air and light, but also because of the perceived level of work involved in maintaining the property. It might behoove sellers to spend a little upfront and hire a professional clutter clearer and/or home stager. This initial cost will be recouped by way of a higher selling price and faster sale

# taging and Sectuttering

Make a clean sweep of all unnecessary articles in attic or basement. Then neatly store boxes and items you wish to keep showing off storage and utility space to the best advantage. Stack magazines and newspapers neatly. Use baskets to store mail, bills, bathroom items or any items that tend to add clutter.







Closets and storage areas will appear more spacious when they are neatly arranged. Remove hanging clothes where possible to avoid the "sardined" look. Line up shoes. Stack boxes in an orderly fashion.


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Remove any pieces of furniture that you can store elsewhere to make rooms look more spacious. Be sure to have an easy flow of traffic through each room.
